Many project sites in California are characterized as rural with little surrounding development. These sites may be

visible from great distances and therefore, the impacts to scenic resources may be extensive. A visual resources assessment includes a discussion of the existing visual resources and an evaluation of the proposed project within the existing environs. The assessment can be based on systems developed by local and State agencies. Photographs taken from various viewpoints around the project are superimposed with the proposed development for a graphic illustration of "before" and "after" conditions for use in the evaluation.
